The teacher preparation programs at BYU-Idaho are set up in a system where a core set of courses serves all programs and meets all Idaho Standards for Initial Certification of Professional School Personnel



Introduction

LC State would love to partner with you to help individuals obtain the necessary educational and pedagogical components to become certified teachers. Our program is designed to be flexible in the approach and can be completed for credit, non-credit, or a combination of both.



Program Components

- Review of Content Competency
- Program of Study
 - Portfolio
 - Coursework
 - Assessments

Content Competency

 Co-determination of educational components that are necessary for the applicant through interviews, review of work history, Professional Development, and Prior Coursework. After which an Individualized Plan of Study is created along with a projected timeline for completion.



Plan of Study

- Candidates can work toward completion through a combination of portfolio completion, coursework, and content assessment to meet the academic requirements necessary for the plan.
- Candidates can complete these requirements for credit, or they can complete without credit, and should they choose purchase the credits later for a fee.



Portfolio

- Each identified competency (course) can be completed by providing evidence of meeting the objectives necessary through a portfolio.
- The portfolio consists of these evidences along with a narrative and annotations of the evidence provided.
- Individualized coaching and mentoring are provided during the process.



Coursework

- Candidates may choose to take existing coursework to demonstrate competency.
- For those who are completing without credit, a flat fee is assessed for each enrollment term. Credit can be added at any time.
- For those who register for credit up-front tuition is collected.



Assessments

- Candidates may choose to challenge course content and are permitted to take assessments for applicable courses.
- Assessments are also available for the Idaho Comprehensive Literacy Components.
- We are also happy to assist with Common Summative Assessments and PRAXIS preparation.



Additional Supports

- Employers also have access to request specific Professional Development to assist candidates as well as current teachers.
- Faculty Mentors are assigned to each candidates and have flexible meeting times.



Other Services

- Mastery-Based Pathway
 - Flexible approach for individuals who would like to obtain initial certification. Available either as a non-traditional pathway (2-3years), or and Alternative Pathway (1 year). Also available for the Teacher to New Certificate option.
- PACE
 - Accelerated pathway toward elementary certification.
- Online Program
 - Applicable for elementary, and some secondary pathways.
