



## Background

The Idaho Digital Learning Academy (IDLA) was created by the Legislature in 2002 with the goal of providing “choice, accessibility, flexibility, quality and equity in curricular offerings” for Idaho students.<sup>1</sup> This is accomplished by pairing technology with the best instructional practices. For education purposes, IDLA is classified as a supplemental program, meaning that students cannot receive a diploma. Rather, credits are transferred from IDLA to the traditional school they attend. Students can register for courses using recommendations from traditional schools, or if they are not affiliated with a traditional school, the student can register directly with the academy.

## Enrollment

Idaho Code 33-1020 counts an enrollment as “each time an Idaho school age child enrolls in an Idaho Digital Learning Academy class and continues to be enrolled in such class past the deadline to withdraw...”. It further clarifies that an individual can be counted as multiple enrollments, meaning that a student enrolled in four IDLA classes counts as four enrollments.

As shown in Table 1, enrollments and students have both increased over the past ten years. Enrollment in IDLA courses has doubled from 25,483 in the 2015 – 2016 school year to 51,452 in the 2024 – 2025 school year. During that same period, the number of students increased from 15,912 to 28,593. These figures show that while both enrollments and students are increasing, enrollments is growing at a faster rate than students. This can be demonstrated by calculating the number of students per enrollment. In the 2015 – 2016 school year, an average student was enrolled in 1.6 classes. During the most recent year, that had increased to 1.8 enrollments per student.

Many IDLA students are also students at a traditional public school or charter school. Table 2 shows a listing of the twenty school districts with the highest number of students taking an IDLA course. The full dataset is available in Appendix 1.

When enrolled in an IDLA course, that student will count as an enrollment for IDLA and for that same class period count toward the school district or charter school average daily attendance (ADA). As defined in Idaho Code 33-1001(4), average daily attendance is the “aggregate number of days enrolled students are present, divided by the number of days of school in the reporting period.” Idaho Code does not provide for calculation adjustments when a student is enrolled in an IDLA class. Because of this, a student can count towards a school district or charter school average daily attendance and as an enrollment for IDLA for the same class period. Table 3 shows the school districts or charter schools that have the highest percentage of enrolled students taking an IDLA course. A full dataset is available in Appendix 2.

## Funding

IDLA receives funding from four sources: state funding, fees from participating school districts, professional development fees, and private grant funding. This combination of funding covers all IDLA expenses, plus allows IDLA to maintain a fund balance.

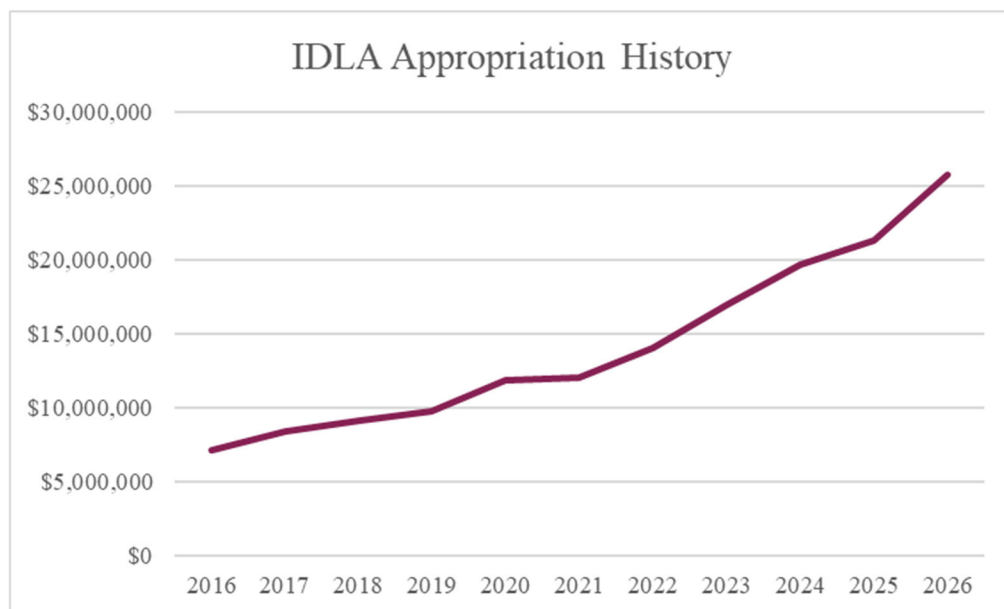
### *State Appropriation*

House Bill 452 (2024) amended Idaho Code 33-1020 to modernize the IDLA funding formula. Following the implementation of HB452 (2024), the funding was calculated at \$430 per enrollment. This formula change saved the state \$1.3 million in FY 2025 and is estimated to save over \$2 million in FY 2026. During the 2025 session, this amount was increased to \$445 per enrollment. (HB 452, 2025). Under this code section, the State Department of Education is directed to transfer 80 percent of the funding for the fiscal year no later than July 31 of each fiscal year. The remaining 20 percent is to be distributed by May 15 once the total enrollment for the fiscal year is determined. If the appropriation is insufficient or, in excess of, the actual

enrollment counts, IDLA is eligible for deposits and withdrawals from the Public Education Stabilization Fund (PESF).<sup>2</sup>

Beginning with FY2024, IDLA has received a standalone appropriation. Prior to that, the appropriation was included in the Public School's Children's Program Division. The Legislature appropriated \$25.8 million dollars for IDLA for FY2026. This represents a 20.8 percent increase over FY2025. An eleven-year appropriation history is shown in Chart 1.

Because Idaho Code does not provide for a funding adjustment when students are enrolled in IDLA courses, the same student counts towards IDLA funding and the average daily attendance that forms the basis for school district funding. As detailed below, the Idaho Department of Education has provided guidance to school districts on how to track attendance for students enrolled in IDLA courses.

### *Other Fees*

In addition to the state appropriation, Idaho Code 33-5508(2) allows IDLA to charge fees to school districts and charter school for each student enrolled in an IDLA class. These fees are to be established by the IDLA Board of Directors each year. House Bill 452 (2025) contained language limiting that charge to not exceed \$40 per enrollment. Previously, the cap was \$75 per enrollment. Idaho Code 33-5508(2) also gives IDLA the authority to charge fees for summer school and professional development offerings. The fees associated with these programs are also

set annually by the IDLA Board of Directors. According to the FY2025 budget prepared by IDLA, over \$2 million was received from school districts and charter schools.

### *IDLA Fund Balance*

Idaho Code 33-5504B provides for the creation of the Idaho Digital Learning Academy Fund (Fund). The Fund will consist of appropriations, collected fees, grants, gifts, and investment earnings. At the end of the 2024 fiscal year, the Fund balance was \$8,493,779. Based on IDLA's proposed 2025 balance, the Fund is projected to decrease to \$7,738,268.

## Idaho Department of Education Guidance

The Idaho Department of Education (SDE) provides guidance to school districts on how student attendance is to be counted.<sup>3</sup> This guidance is based on IDAPA 08.02.01.250.01 which provides that a day in session is when “students are under the guidance and direction of teachers in the teaching process for not less than four (4) hours...” IDAPA 08.02.01.250.03 also states that a day of attendance is when a student is “under the guidance and direction of a teacher or other authorized school district personnel while school is in session and under the instruction of a teacher employed ... through the Idaho digital learning academy...” Under the SDE guidance, when taken together, these provisions allow a school district to count students towards ADA. Specifically, the guidance states that “students taking courses from the Idaho Digital Learning Academy, a public school-choice learning environment, can have these courses positively impact attendance and ADA.” Here is an example of a student who attends four (4) 55-minute periods at a local high school and one course from IDLA. For attendance purposes, the student would count as a 1.0 value because when the time is added, the student meets the four hour a day minimum, as required in IDAPA 08.02.01.250.01 and because of the lack of legal separation, they also count as one enrollment for IDLA.
